

About the Library

Dormont Public Library, founded in 1936, is an independent community library serving Dormont Borough and neighboring communities in the South Hills.

We offer a collection of over 33,000 items including books, audiobooks, movies, and more. As part of the Allegheny County Library Association, we are also able to request items from any library in Allegheny County for hassle-free borrowing. With a library card, you can also borrow ebooks and streaming content at no cost to you.

Library cards are free to all residents of Allegheny County. **We are a fine-free library**; no daily overdue fees are charged for items owned by us.

We also offer a variety of technology and reference services to the public, including:

- Free public computer use in a staffed computer lab
- Free Wi-Fi access during opening hours, and 24/7 outdoors, as far as the signal reaches
- Printing, scanning, copying, and faxing service
- Remote printing: email us a document and we'll print it for you to pick up
- Informal one-to-one technology help by appointment
- Reference lookups and general information questions
- Other services on request; if we can't provide it we'll do our best to direct you to someone who can.

Very Important Note

Registration is required for all programs for adults and children, so that we can have sufficient supplies and table space for programs.

Summer Reading Challenge

Join the Reading Challenge and win prizes just for reading! This year, log your books with your choice of the Beanstack reading tracker or on paper at the library.

Adult readers need to read 3 books during Summer Reading to complete the challenge. After that, earn a raffle ticket for every 3 books you read, up to a maximum of 25 books (with an extra ticket at 25.) The raffle drawing will be held after the end of the program in August.

Children and young adults need to read 5 books during Summer Reading to complete the challenge. For very young children, listening to someone else read a book also counts. At 5 books read, each participant will receive a completion certificate. Readers can continue earning milestone prizes for every 5 books read, to a maximum of 50. Anyone who reads 50 books will receive a special certificate for their accomplishment.

Books read as part of the challenge should be checked out from Dormont Public Library, but this is not a requirement.

All books read as part of the challenge should be at an appropriate reading level

We would like to ask families to participate in the Summer Reading Program at the library, since we have a variety of in-person incentives you might miss out on by participating virtually. We are still offering the Beanstack reading tracker as an alternative for families who would not otherwise be able to participate.

After the game, get signed up for this year's Summer Reading Challenge and check out some books to get yourself started!




Storytime in the Park

Monday and Thursday in the same week have the same story and craft, so choose whichever time works best for you.



Young Adults Special Programs


We're looking for creative-minded teens to join us with some big projects this summer.


